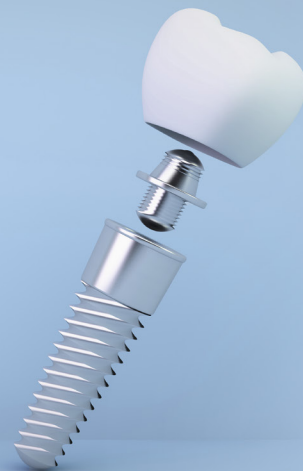

DENTAL IMPLANTS vs. DENTURES, FLIPPERS, and BRIDGES

In years past, the most common treatment for when someone lost a tooth or many teeth was to put in a partial denture or a full denture. Now, even though dentures do provide relief, by no means do they act as a complete or perfect solution. Indeed, they have a number of significant drawbacks:

- Dentures can cause pain while eating, which can lead you to give up foods you love like apples, steak, corn on the cob, and many more.
- Even the best-fitted dentures can become uncomfortable during use.
- Dentures can be inconvenient to use and maintain, requiring additional hassles that make living a fully normal life a challenge.
- Long-term denture wearers can actually experience jawbone loss (this is the cause of the collapsed and wrinkled face that afflicts many who wear them).

These and many other reasons are why so many patients now consider dental implants as a possible solution. With dental implants, you can toss away dentures and instead have a fully restored smile, with perfectly fitting teeth that look and work like the ones you were born with. They are truly the closest thing to natural healthy teeth you could ever have.

Most dentists who have been trained in dental implants will recommend an implant over a denture or refer you to a specialist, because of the health benefits, strength and functional benefits, as well as appearance benefits of dental implants.

HOW TO TELL WHICH TYPE YOU NEED

SITUATION



A single tooth is all it takes to make someone uncomfortable and self-conscious when you talk, laugh, or smile. A single missing tooth can also cause your other teeth to shift and shrink your jawbone.

IMPLANT



With dental implants there is no need to:

- Grind any of your teeth down
- Worry about the food you eat or having it fall out

BRIDGE



In order to fit a bridge, we have to:

- Grind adjacent teeth down
- Anchor it to other teeth
- Bridges are known for being finicky and looking unconvincing

SITUATION



With multiple missing teeth, you also miss out on confidence and eating all of the food you love. Increased risk of jaw transformation also occurs at a higher rate.

IMPLANT



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REMOVABLE PARTIAL



In order to fit a partial, we have to:

- Use clasps or retainers
- Usually uncomfortable and unsightly
- Grind on healthy teeth
- Often remove them to eat

SITUATION



If you are missing all of your teeth, you are extremely limited on the foods you can enjoy. Also, you probably don't smile or laugh that often, due to embarrassment.

IMPLANT



Implants are a great option for people missing all of their teeth. The denture is attached using the implanted posts, so you never have to take them out, or worry about them falling out. Eat the food you love! Laugh! Smile!

DENTURE + ADHESIVE



Dentures are attached with strips of sticky adhesive that don't work too well. They will become unsecure and may fall out during the day. They are hard to place in the mouth, and feel uncomfortable.

HOW DENTAL IMPLANTS WORK

The basic technology behind implant dentistry is actually quite simple and easy to understand. The typical dental implant consists of the following elements:

TITANIUM IMPLANT

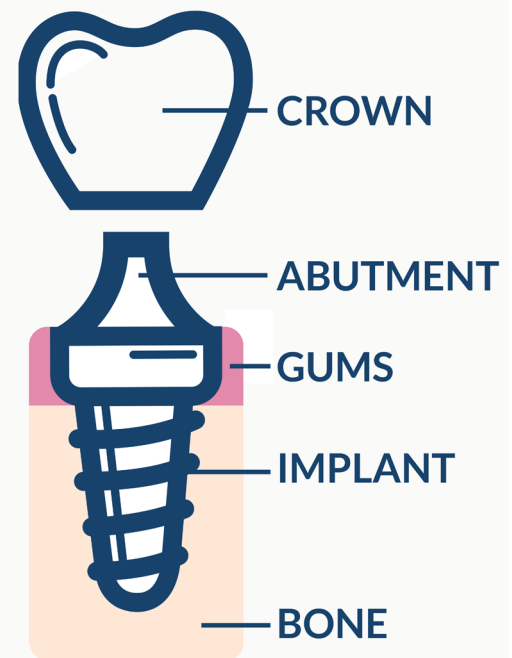
This goes directly into your jawbone to create a tight, secure structure.

AN IMPLANT ABUTMENT

This attaches to the implant to form the tooth above the gum line.

A MANUFACTURED CROWN

A crown is then milled to match your other teeth. Perfectly suited for biting, chewing, brushing, flossing, just like your natural teeth.



When we perform the procedure, we place a titanium implant to replace the root portion of a missing natural tooth – and then, on top of that is placed an implant abutment. To finish the process we place the replacement tooth (crown) fashioned to look and function exactly like your own natural teeth.

Note: Even though your dental implants will not be affected by decay or cavities, you will still have to care for them the same way you would care for your original teeth.

Dental implants preserve your jaw bone and prevent the natural shrinkage that cause extra wrinkles and the appearance of pre-mature aging. A bridge or removable partial denture does not preserve or maintain your bone.

THE FIVE KEY FACTORS AFFECTING DENTAL IMPLANT PRICING

The first thing everyone asks when considering implants is “how much will it cost?” The answer can depend on many factors that all work together.

1. Skill Level / Experience

The basics of safe implant dentistry are actually not that complex. Most dentists can acquire the knowledge to perform implants relatively quickly, in some cases over a few intensive weekend seminars. Nevertheless, as with any field, experience and continuing education can make a big difference in the actual patient experience and outcomes.

As you might expect, a doctor less experienced and less knowledgeable in this field will accordingly charge lower fees. But this is definitely one area where you don’t want to scrimp you want to have confidence that your doctor has the skill level necessary to handle any problems that may arise.

2. The Number of Implants Needed

Every mouth and every situation is unique, which is why advertising offering “one-sized-fits-all” kinds of deals should be eyed with suspicion. As the old saying goes, “you can’t get something for nothing.” So when you see a flat price offered for implants without any consideration given to what the patient may actually NEED in order to achieve a glowing smile and a healthy mouth then you can know that the offer is almost certainly “too good to be true.”

The only way to get a final, realistic price on exactly what you need, is to go in for a complete oral assessment that includes a full exam, X-ray, and a detailed analysis based on your current health and your lifestyle goals.

3. The Type of Dental Implants Used

While relatively simple in concept, there are literally hundreds of options available when it comes to choosing the right dental implant for your unique situation. The implant, the

crown, and the abutment (which connects the crown with the implant) all come with varying price tags and from a range of manufacturers.

Choosing the right combination requires interaction between you and your doctor, to make certain your needs medically, esthetically, and financially are all balanced and met.

4. Technology and Equipment

One factor often overlooked in pricing is the overall quality of experience provided through the use of up-to-date systems and technologies. To assess value properly, you must consider details like high quality diagnostic tools, the number and types of sedation options, surgical procedures, health monitoring equipment, and much more.

Dental technology has advanced dramatically in just the past decade and older patients who once refused to see a dentist due to “less-than-positive” experience as a child are now amazed at how comfortable and pain free modern dentistry can be when the latest tools get paired with modern techniques.

5. Your Unique Health Situation

Just as no two dentists are alike, it's even more true that no two patients are alike. Your unique, personal medical history affects the costs involved to get you to health and appearance you desire and deserve.

That's why you need to rely on the expertise of a skilled implant dentist who knows how to assess and consider the underlying conditions that may affect someone's suitability for dental implants. For instance, in some very rare cases where the jaw bone is too thin or too soft, bone grafts could be necessary to ensure ultimate success.

And in the case where you've recently lost a tooth, it's important to let your dentist know this and to act as quickly as possible. If you don't get an implant within a year of losing the tooth, the jaw bone that surrounded the missing tooth begins to shrink eventually becoming too small to even support an implant.

Consider This When “Counting the Cost”

As you might guess, any one of these factors can make a huge difference in determining the final investment required.

1. Additionally, they offer a very real warning to exercise caution when considering “cut-rate” dental implant offers you may see advertised. In order to achieve these extremely low fees, corners typically have to get cut somewhere either in the quality of materials used, the expertise of the dentist involved, and the level of attention provided both before and after the procedure.
2. It’s also important to evaluate the cost of implants in comparison to other alternatives. For example, if you use a dentist skilled in the practice, a dental implant could well cost less and last longer than the effort necessary to restore and save a tooth. In the case of dental bridges, implants can often cost less long term due the recurring costs required to maintain the bridge.
3. Finally, how can you judge the cost of having the ability to enjoy any food you want once again? To savor a delicious steak, cooked to prime perfection to bite into a crisp, juicy apple packed with vitamins and fiber to enjoy fresh sweet corn on the cob without fear or struggle it’s little pleasures like these and many more that can bring renewed joy as well as healthy benefits to daily life.

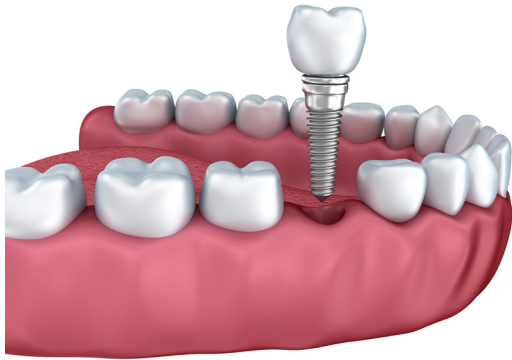

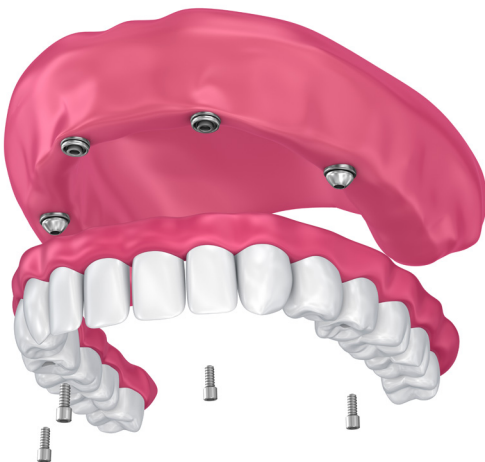
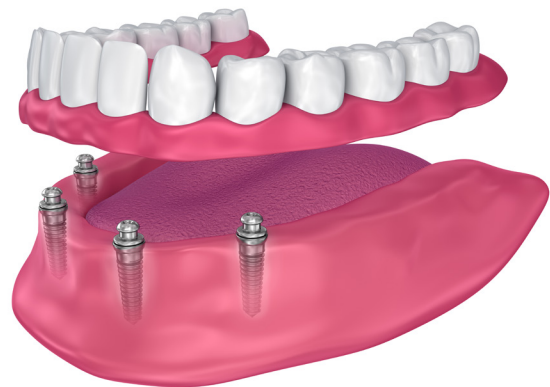

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DID YOU KNOW?

Teeth restored with dental implants can't get cavities! A replacement tooth, or crown, doesn't decay like a natural tooth, but you still have to brush, floss and care for it and your surrounding natural teeth and gums in the same manner as natural teeth.

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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: “How soon can it be done? Can it really be within an hour or the same day?”

A: Most of the time, the answer is YES, it can be done that very same day. For example, a man came into our office with a bridge in his hand, thinking it would take a couple weeks. He left later that day with a full set of teeth that he never has to take out, they are his permanent teeth.

Q: “If you have bad gums, gum disease, is this still possible?”

A: Absolutely. It's like a re-do - a do-over - when gums are bad. We start over and get the gums to a healthy state once again. And then, when they have healthy bone there as a foundation, we can put in the implants and now they're just like real teeth and we maintain them.

Q: “Can I really eat anything I want to again?”

A: Absolutely. They're just like real teeth. You can eat apples, beefjerky, anything you want. I've had people literally in tears because they're so appreciative.

Q: “When you get implants, do you have to go to one doctor, then another, then another to get the whole thing done?”

A: No, you don't. Just me. I'm trained in all the necessary specialties. Plus, I've been practicing dental implants from the beginning and you can be reassured I have lots of practical experience getting you the results you want.

Q: “Is there any kind of age limit to getting dental implants?”

A: No - it's really your health. And if you're healthy enough to walk into my office, you're probably healthy enough to get dental implants.

Q: “What about pain? Both during the procedure and afterwards. Should I be scared?”

A: Not at all. That's what we want, nobody wants pain, I don't either! For the procedure itself, we have sedation. Basically it's like taking a quick nap and waking up with a whole new smile. Post-op, about 90% of the people I see, they come in the next day and they're shocked - they're not bruising, they're not swollen, they're not having pain. The other 10% of the people might have a tougher time, depending on who they are, but 90% have no problem at all.

Q: “Are you sure you can do this, right away?”

A: I hear them say this every time. They're skeptical. Surprised. Shocked. “We can do this today?” The answer is yes, we can take care of this right away and you can have that healthy smile you've always wanted.
